

SCOPE OF THE JOURNAL AND GUIDELINES FOR AUTHORS

General info

The journal "Bulletin of KRAESC. Physical & Mathematical Sciences" publishes the results of basic and applied research in the area of physical and mathematical sciences (mathematical modeling, mathematical physics, information and computational technologies, educational materials) including extended abstracts of doctor or candidate of science dissertations. The journal may also publish flashes, reviews, newsletters, information on scientific events, congresses, conferences, workshops, seminars and so on.

The Journal was founded in August 2010, registered at the Federal Service for Compliance with the Law in Mass Communications and Protection of Cultural Heritage (Media Organization registration certificate № FS 77-41501 from 04.08.2010), and re-registered (certificate № FS 77-58548 from 14.07.2014).

The Journal founders are the Federal State Budget Research Institution "Vitus Bering Kamchatka State University" (www.kamgu.ru), and the Federal State Budget Research Institution "Institute of Cosmophysical Research and Radio Wave Propagation Far Eastern Branch of the Russian Academy of Sciences" (www.ikir.ru).

The Journal is issued in print (ISSN: 2079-6641) and online (ISSN: 2079-665X) versions four times a year in Russian (<http://www.ikir.ru/ru/krasec/journal/index.html>) and it is also translated into English (ISSN: 2313-0156) (<http://www.ikir.ru/en/krasec/journal/index.html>).

The Journal is posted on the "Math.-Net.Ru" Russian Mathematical Portal and is indexed in Google Scholar, DOAJ, OCLC WorldCat, Bielefeld Academic Search Engine (BASE), Open Access Infrastructure for Research in Europe (OpenAIRE), DataCite, Directory of Research Journals Indexing, Kyberlenika, Socionet, included into the Russian Science Citation Index (RSCI)

(<http://www.elibrary.ru>) and has Russian Impact Factor (<http://impact-factor.ru/>).

Full-text articles are posed at the e-library of Vitus Bering Kamchatka State University (<http://bibl.kamgpu.ru>), on the site of the Institute of Cosmophysical Research and Radio Wave Propagation FEB RAS (www.ikir.ru) and at Kyberlenika e-library <http://cyberleninka.ru/>.

Each article of the Journal is assigned a Digital Object Identifier which is listed in the base on www.datacite.org.

Journal Policy

1. **Free access policy.** The journal is an open access journal which means that everybody can read, download, copy, distribute, print, search, or link to the full texts of these articles in accordance with CC License.

You are free to:

Share – copy and redistribute the material in any medium or format;

Adapt – remix, transform, and build upon the material for any purpose, even commercially.

The licensor cannot revoke these freedoms as long as you follow the license terms.

Under the following terms:

Attribution — You must give appropriate credit, provide a link to the license, and indicate if changes were made. You may do so in any reasonable manner, but not in any way that suggests the licensor endorses you or your use.

No additional restrictions — You may not apply legal terms or technological measures that legally restrict others from doing anything the license permits.

License type: Attribution 4.0 International (CC BY 4.0).

An authors should attach to the manuscript and other documents a covering letter where he/she transfers the copyright to publish the manuscript as an open access paper.

2. Article identification policy. Each article is assigned a DOI (Digital object identifier).

3. Plagiarism detection policy. All the submitted manuscripts are checked for the plagiarism via the Text.ru system. To be accepted, the paper should contain 75% of text uniqueness.

Publication ethics

Standards of ethical conduct should be coordinated for all the participants of the publication process (author, editor, reviewer and publisher).

The Journal publication ethics corresponds to the requirements of COPE Best Practice Guidelines for Journal Editors.

1. Decision for publication. The Editor decides which of the manuscripts submitted to the Journal should be published. The Editor is within the right to follow the Editorial Board policy but he/she may be limited by the active legislation. The Editor may consult other editors or reviewers to make a decision.

2. Tolerance. The Editor evaluates the intellectual content of a manuscript regardless of author's race, sex, sexual orientation, religion, ethnic origin, citizenship and political views.

3. Confidentiality. The Editor and Editorial staff are not within the right to disclose information of a submitted manuscript to anybody but the author, reviewers, potential reviewers, other editorial consultants and a publisher, if necessary.

Any manuscript submitted for reviewing should be considered as a confidential document. The materials should not be shown or discussed with anybody but those authorized by the Editor.

4. Disclosure of information and conflict of interests. Unpublished materials of the submitted manuscript should not be used in the investigations by the Editor without a letter of consent of the author.

The confidential information or the ideas obtained during the reviewing process should be kept secret and should not be used for personal purposes. Reviewers should not consider the manuscripts where they disclose conflicts of interests resultant from competition, cooperation or other relations with one of the authors, companies or institutions related to the paper.

5. Responsibilities of reviewers. Contribution into the editorial decision. Reviewing helps the Editor to make editorial decisions as well as communication of the Editor with an author can help the author to improve his work.

6. Efficiency. Any chosen reviewer, feeling his/her incompetence to review the investigation of a manuscript and supposing that it will be impossible to consider a manuscript promptly, should inform the Editor and exclude himself/herself from the reviewing processes.

7. Objectivity. Reviews should be objective. Personal criticism of the author is irrelevant. Reviewers should express their opinions clearly and in a well-argued manner.

8. References. Reference to the corresponding papers of other authors is an essential requirement. Authors should refer to the publications which exercised a decisive influence on the manuscript.

Reviewers should reveal the papers which were not referred to by an author. Any statements, observations, conclusions or arguments should be accompanied by a corresponding reference.

A reviewer should also pay the Editor's attention to any significant similarity or coincidence between the manuscript under consideration and any other published paper.

9. Responsibilities of authors. A manuscript should contain enough details to be verifiable. Fraudulent or deliberately incorrect information is unethical and unacceptable.

10. Originality and plagiarism. Authors of a manuscript should ensure that they submit an original work. If they apply papers and/or quotations of other authors, references or extracts are obligatory. All the submitted manuscripts are checked for the plagiarism via the Text.ru system. To be accepted, a paper should contain at least 75% of text uniqueness.

11. Multiple, simultaneous publications. An author should not publish papers describing the same research in more than one journal or primary publication. Submission of the same manuscript to more than one journal simultaneously is unethical and unacceptable.

12. Authorship. The authorship should be limited by those who made significant contribution into a conception, design, realization or interpretation of a described research. They should be listed as co-authors. If there are other participants who made any contribution into the work, they should be listed as participants. An author should guarantee objective co-authors and ensure that all the co-authors have read and approved the final version of a manuscript and agreed to submit it for publication.

13. Disclosure of information and conflict of interests. In the papers, all the authors should disclose the information on funding and on third party's interests which may be considered as having affected the results or interpretation of the manuscript.

14. Errors in published papers. If an author finds a significant error or inaccuracy in his/her published paper, the author should inform the Editor of the Journal or the publisher and cooperate with the Editor to suppress the paper or make corrections.

Reviewing

The Journal is a peer-reviewed journal. Main specialists in the area of physical and mathematical sciences make scientific assessment of manuscripts.

1. An author submits a manuscript prepared according to the "Guidelines for authors" to the Editorial Board.

2. Having received a manuscript from an author, the Senior Secretary decides whether the manuscript corresponds to the scope of the Journal and sends it to an independent reviewer for consideration.

3. Manuscripts are reviewed by leading specialists in the corresponding scientific areas. Reviewing is confidential.

4. A reviewer decides on the possibility of publication of a manuscript within three months.

5. In case of positive decision, the Editor-in-Chief determines the order of publications depending on themes of Journal issues.

6. If there are any comments, a reviewer may decide to send the manuscript back to the author for revision. After the revision the manuscript is sent to the reviewer again. If the decision of a reviewer is negative, the manuscript is rejected.

7. The Editorial Board send a message to the author with the results of reviewing; rejected manuscripts are not discussed with authors. Editor-in-Chief makes the decision in case of a conflict.

8. If requested, the Editorial Board send copies of reviews to the Ministry of Education and Science of Russian Federation or to State Commission for Academic Degrees and Titles.

9. Originals of the reviews are stored in the publishing house and in the editorial office for 5 years. Journal Executive Secretary is responsible for review storage.

10. Materials sent to the editorial office are not returned back to the authors.

11. Editorial Board does not take any obligations on the date of publication.

12. Authors are not charged for publication and are not paid any fees.

General guidelines

1. The structure of a manuscript should include the following: title in the Russian and in the English languages, initials and surnames of the authors, their affiliations, an abstract, keywords, UDC (<http://udc.biblio.uspu.ru/>), MSC (<http://www.ams.org/msc/>) or PACS (<https://www.aip.org/pacs>) indexes of the paper, introduction, the aim of the research, the data and methods of the research, results of the research and discussion, conclusions and the list of references.

2. Tables should contain only the necessary data, generalized and statistically processed information. Each table should have a heading and be put into the text after a paragraph with the first reference to it.

3. Each figure should have a caption which explains all its elements. Figures are submitted in separate files in jpg, png or eps formats **for the Russian and the English versions separately.**

4. References in the text should be in square brackets as they appear in the manuscript. The recommended number of references for a scientific paper is not less than 10. It is preferable that 50% of them are the references to the papers from foreign journals and from other foreign sources.

When making a reference list, `amsbid.sty` package should be used. It is meant for processing of references in LaTeX publication system applying AMS-TeX commands. Application of these commands allows one to avoid explicit markup of a reference list (explicit display of different elements by various fonts, punctuation, brackets etc.) and inevitable change of files to prepare manuscripts for submission. It also allows one to make hyperlinks in references automatically. The `amsbib.sty` package contains adapted reference design programs from the `amspt.sty` style sheet and some additional commands expanding opportunities of typesetting and simplifying the process of making hyperlinks. The style of reference formatting of `amsbib.sty` package corresponds to that accepted for the top journals of the Branch of Mathematical Sciences, RAS.

The `amsbib` package and its description may be downloaded on the site of "Math-Net.Ru" Russian Mathematical Portal.

If it causes much difficulties to make references by `amsbib.sty` package, an author may do that according to the State Standard R 7.05-2008 (omitting the signs / and // which are not recognized by search systems of international data basis), and the reference list will be processed by the Editorial staff during formatting.

The essential requirement is that the references should be written in Latin characters.

It means that

1) if a paper is in English, nothing should be done, for example:

Hudelson M., Klee V., Larman D., "Largest j -simplices in d -cubes: some relatives of the Hadamard maximum determinant problem", *Linear Algebra Appl.*, 241 (1996), 519–598.

2) if a paper is in Russian, and there is an English version of it, the author should refer to the both, for example:

Бурд В.Ш., Каракулин В.А., "Асимптотическое интегрирование систем линейных дифференциальных уравнений с колебательно убывающими коэффициентами", *Математические заметки*, 64:5 (1998), 658–666; English transl.: Burd V.Sh., Karakulin V.A., "On the asymptotic integration of systems of linear differential equations with oscillatory decreasing coefficients", *Math. Notes*, 64:5 (1998), 571–578.

3) if a paper or a book is in Russian and there is no English translation, it is necessary to transliterate it. To transliterate Russian words into Latin letters, the author should use the site www.translit.ru, choosing the BGN transliteration standard (menu in the right upper corner). For example:

Кашенко С.А., Майоров В.В. “Исследование дифференциально-разностных уравнений, моделирующих импульсную активность нейрона”, Матем. моделирование, 5:12 (1993), 13–25 [Kashchenko S.A., Mayorov V.V., “Issledovanie differentsialno-raznostnykh uravneniy, modeliruyushchikh impulsnyuyu aktivnost neyrona”, Matem. Mod., 5:12 (1993), 13–25 (in Russian)].

4) If a paper or a book has more than three authors, the first author and et al. should be written.

Ахромеева Т.С. и др., Структуры и хаос в нелинейных средах. Физматлит, М., 2007. [Ahromeeva T.S. et al., Struktury i haos v nelineynykh sredah, Fizmatlit, Moskva, 2007 (in Russian)].

It is necessary to translate the Russian references which have no English versions into the English language for the English version of the Journal.

For example:

Rekhviashvili S.Sh. Razmernye yavleniya v fizike kondensirovannogo sostoyaniya i nanotekhnologiyakh [Dimensional phenomena in condensed matter physics and nanotechnologies]. Nalchik, KBNTs RAN, 2014. 250 p.

5. The maximum length of a manuscript should not exceed 20 pages and 40 pages for a review, A4 format.

Manuscripts in tex format are accepted. If a manuscript is prepared in Latex publishing system, please, use the mfitjournal.cls. journal class. It may be downloaded from the Journal site <http://www.ikir.ru/ru/krasec/journal/index.html> as well as an explanatory example.

6. The following information about the authors should be enclosed to the manuscript:

– Surname, name and patronymic name with transliteration. The name should be transliterated in the system of www.translit.ru choosing the BGN standard.

both in Russian and in English:

– Affiliation and address, position, academic degree, academic title, e-mail address for each author.

– ORCID identification code. A unique ORCID-identifier may be obtained on the site <http://orcid.org>.

– High quality pictures of each author in any of the formats: jpg, png, eps.

7. The Editorial Board reserves the right to abridge and to edit manuscripts.

8. A manuscript, signed by an author(s) is submitted by e-mail to the Senior Secretary romanparovik@gmail.com. The following documents should be enclosed:

– information about the authors;

– a scanned copy of a covering letter signed by the Head of an organization or the authors; it contains information on open access publication of the manuscript and on the documents which the author sends (where and with what purpose);

– a copy of an expert report on the letterhead paper signed by the Head of the organization with a stamp; it contains information that the manuscript may be published for public access and does not contain any secret data.

9. To cut the time for manuscript processing, authors may upload their manuscripts with document copies on the Journal page http://www.mathnet.ru/php/journal.phtml?jrnid=vkam&option_lang=rus of Math-Net.ru portal, **after having authorized.**

Guidelines for the covering letter

The covering letter for a manuscript should be on the on the letterhead paper signed by the Head of the organization.

If the covering letter is not written on the letterhead paper signed by the Head of the organization, it should be signed by all the authors of the manuscript.

The covering letter should (!) contain the following text:

«By the present we ensure that publication of the scientific paper in the Journal «Bulletin of KRAESC. Physical & Mathematical Sciences» does not violate any copyright. The author(s)

transfers to the Journal founder the non-exclusive rights to use the scientific paper for an identified period by publishing full-text versions of issues on the Journal Internet-site.

The author(s) is responsible for the misuse of the items of intellectual property and of copyright in the paper according to the RF law in action.

The author(s) confirms that the submitted manuscript has not been published before, was not submitted and will not be submitted for other scientific publications.

We also confirm that the author(s) agrees with the requirements for preparation of a manuscript for publication accepted by the Editorial Board of the Journal «Bulletin of KRAESC. Physical & Mathematical Sciences» posted on its official site.».

If there are four and more authors, the heading is not applied (State Standard 7.80-2000).

It is admitted to change the prescribed sign of a dot and a dash, dividing the parts of bibliographic description, by a dot.

It is admitted not to use square brackets for the information borrowed not from the prescribed source of information.

Raizberg B.A. Modern economy dictionary. B.A. Raizberg, L.B. Lozovskii, E.B. Starodubtseva. 5-th ed. Moscow:INFRA-M, 2006. 494 p.

The text title in a reference may contain the names of one, two or three authors of a document. Author names written in the title are not to be repeated in the information on responsibility. Thus:

Raizberg B.A., Lozovskii L.B., Starodubtseva E.B. Modern economy dictionary. 5-th ed., Moscow:INFRA-M, 2006. 494 p.

If there are four authors and more, the title is not applied (State Standard 7.80-2000).
